TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN AND COLLEAGUES:

Once again, it is my great pleasure to say to you something brief, but accurate, about Chiang Mai-Based Disabled Campus Club (DCC) and its magnificent and wonderful staff.

My many years of having known the campus and its always energetic, staunch and loyal members and occasionally participated in their well-planned, well-implemented activities tell me loudly and clearly that what we today have and can be proud of is another small group of young to middle-aged, "educated", competent, devoted, determined, optimistic, caring and joyful disabled Thais who, in my opinion, have already made some difference, and certainly will continue to do so, in the lives of many disabled persons in the Chiang Mai-Lamphun Basin and Northern Thailand areas. As we all know, many great changes in our world were, are being and will continue to be brought about by small bands of people.

The disabled community of Northern Thailand and, for that matter, the whole of Northern Thailand will never be the same again with CM DCC's presence.

As individuals, each of its members is very unique as far as personal knowledge, skills, experiences and visions are concerned. Each is and has demonstrably been capable of carrying out his/her mutually determined assignments as well as reaching out to his/her personal friends and acquaintances who normally can not physically be present at the Campus and participate in its regular in-house and outside activities. When combined, as I mentioned above, they form/constitute quite a formidable, though numerically small, force making its presence felt including in the community of normal/abled persons as well. This particular point can be seen from the score of prominent individuals and organizations, private and public, CM DCC has been in contact and working with. They are both Thai and foreign. I would be more than happy to submit to you more detailed report of latest developments later, i.e., toward the end of September or early October, after they have successfully dealt with the second flood problem (September 5-6-7). They, the Campus and 7 disabled staff trapped inside the house-cum-office, were hit hard mid-August when the biggest floods in 40-year time filled it to almost its half height without any advanced warning.

In brief, particularly since late March, 2003 when the US Consul General, Eric Rubin, officially declared open CM DCC former campus, situated even at the much lower-level location than the August and September flooded one, until now, I can honestly inform and want to proudly share with you the tremendous growth and progress of CM DCC, as an organization, and its unique bona fide personnel, as major driving forces. Because of your appreciation and support, they were able to make it this far. Yet, they still have a long way to go and a lot more things to accomplish both within/for the community of disabled and that of normal/abled persons. Their long journey into the future and long list of worthwhile tasks ahead, I confirm, more than deserve your continued appreciation and support. Personally, I have already conveyed to CM DCC staff that upon my taking office as next Dean of Faculty of Education starting November 1, 2005, they will certainly be able to add to their list of partners and colleagues another academic, higher education-level organization, Faculty of Education, Chiang Mai University, and continuously enjoy my personal and organizational/institutional appreciation, faith and support.

Finally, let me convey my best regards and appreciation to all of you at GCF and outside friends who have been bestowing great understanding and trust upon CM DCC and, I know, continue to do so in the future. Anything I can do to be of help, please do not hesitate to let me know.

Provide opportunities for the students and Faculty of Fine Arts to develop relationships with other disability organizations and University programs affiliated with GCF and its international campuses.

Explore the potential of cosponsoring cultural interchanges, seminars, and conferences.

Explore opportunities for educational interaction and participatory action research with Global Campuses Foundation (GCF), Global Campus Chiang Mai (GCC) and other satellite campuses.

Respond to opportunities for other forms of cooperation that might arise from time to time.

Staff members of the Parties will be encouraged to consult with each other and to develop specific plans for collaboration in any of the ways mentioned above.

Recognizing that any form of academic collaboration depends on the availability of funds and human resources. Both Parties will expend efforts to find suitable sources of funding to support the activities proposed in this Memorandum.

Examples of the Parties' opportunity to provide human and financial support for agreed upon activities are:

GCF Provides:

- expertise: adult education, continuing education, disability studies, disability culture
- GCF network of campuses-USA and S.E. Asia
- linkage with other GCF partners such as Vermont Human Services Agencies, USA Universities, and other disability organizations
- co-author grants and other funding proposals; provide GCF research of funding sources
- curricula and methodologies for educational development of persons with disabilities
- professional development opportunities such as potential travel and exchanges

GCC Provides:

- expertise from the voice and perspective of adults with disabilities; 21st century, new generation, primary experience of disability
- educational formats such as workshops, simulations, seminars, trainings
- consultation and advisement for students and faculty;
- peer support for CMU students with disabilities and for their families and allies

Faculty of Fine Arts provides:

- expertise of faculty and administrators in their respective discipline and specialized areas particularly which facilitate joint action research projects; both large and small
- ongoing cooperation and promotion of the opportunities through this MOU with GCF/GCC
- co-author grant proposals
- commitment to ensure that an awareness of Disability Culture is promoted at Faculty of Fine Arts
- space on campus for meetings, seminars, workshops, classes, office etc.

This Memorandum will become effective on the date that representatives of both parties sign and will be valid for a period of five years. The Memorandum may be extended beyond that period after discussion with representatives of both Parties.

This Memorandum may be revised or modified within the period of its validity by mutual consent. It may also be terminated within that period by either party by giving the other Party not less than 90 days notice of its intention to terminate it.

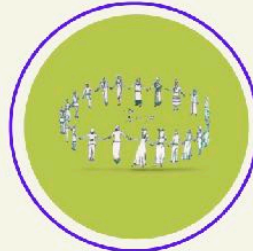
